Our Story

Founded by St Augustine in 597 AD, Canterbury Cathedral is a unique place of worship, a major pilgrimage destination, a masterpiece of art and architecture, and one of the UK's most-visited historic sites. Often referred to as 'England in stone', the Cathedral has been at the centre of momentous events and upheavals. It is the Mother Church of the worldwide Anglican Communion, seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, UNESCO World Heritage Site, and resting place of royalty and saints.

Our vision is to welcome everyone, to inspire and support them on their journey of faith, and to create a Cathedral community that is a sanctuary for all. Faithful to Christ the Good Shepherd, we aspire to embody the following behaviours in our community culture: Compassion, Collaboration, Commitment and Curiosity.

Volunteer Role: Volunteer Flower Arranger

Role Description:

Experience in flower arranging is necessary for this role.

Our flower arrangers use fresh flowers to create the beauty of nature within the Cathedral; they use colour and form with selected flowers that bring to life the liturgical colours which are used to celebrate Cathedral worship over the year.

Whilst creating these beautiful displays, our floral volunteers may also share information about flower arranging with Cathedral visitors.

If you are interested in this role, please note that you will need to commit to at least two weeks of duties, twice a year. Flowers are arranged on a Friday, every two weeks (except during Lent and Advent) and you will share the daily watering duties with other volunteers who are on your two-week rotation.

You may also have the opportunity to create flower arrangements for special occasions, such as weddings and festivals.



Key Responsibilities

This role will involve:

- Providing your own greenery, whilst using flowers that have been selected by the Head of the Flower Guild, when creating floral displays.
- Arranging flowers in various areas of the Cathedral.
- Maintaining flower arrangements, by watering them based on a rota system.
- Maintaining a safe and clean work environment, and ensuring that all rubbish is disposed of correctly.
- Being aware of security risks, and not leaving scissors, secateurs and knives unattended.
- Reporting any accidents or incidents to the appropriate staff member promptly.
- Being part of a diverse and creative team.
- Adhering to the Cathedral Behaviour Framework and Code of Conduct.
- Supporting creating a diverse and inclusive Cathedral where everyone is welcome.
- Supporting and embodying the mission and values of the Cathedral.
- Complying with the Church of England Safeguarding and GDPR policies.
- Attending training sessions, as required.
- Wearing your Cathedral Volunteer photo ID badge when on duty, which will be provided when you start your role.

Skills

If you have the following skills, then this role is for you.

- Experience in flower arranging.
- A creative eye for floral design.
- Able to follow instructions.
- Able to operate alone or as part of a team.
- Can use your own initiative, but will ask others for guidance when necessary.
- Ability to meet time commitments and provide reasonable notice if unable to.
- Enjoy interaction with people.
- A clear understanding of health and safety risks.
- Awareness of security risks.
- Ability to stay calm in challenging situations.

Training and Support

The Cathedral will provide:

- Full training for the role; incl. GDPR, Health and Safety, fire evacuation, and Safeguarding.
- Regular contact with your volunteer manager.
- A welcome pack; incl. the Cathedral's Strategic Plan, Volunteer Handbook, and other information.
- A safe environment to volunteer in.

Volunteer Benefits

- Making an important contribution to the Cathedral; the Mother Church of the worldwide Anglican Communion, seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, and part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- The opportunity to develop new and existing skills and gain experience volunteering.
- A chance to meet new people and share your passion and skills with staff and other volunteers.
- The satisfaction of knowing you are making an important contribution to the work of the Cathedral and supporting the Cathedral's strategy and mission.

- 20% discount in the Cathedral Shop, and 10% discount in the Cathedral Lodge Hotel.
- All volunteers can enjoy free Cathedral entry for themselves and immediate family (this applies to sightseeing entry only, and does not include ticketed/paid events).

Dress Code

Volunteer Flower Arrangers should wear comfortable and practical attire for the role, whilst maintaining a well-presented professional appearance, as a representative of the Cathedral.

All volunteers are required to wear their Cathedral photo ID badge when on duty.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Time Commitment / Duration

You will be required to commit to at least two weeks of duties, twice a year. Flowers are arranged on a Friday, every two weeks (except during Lent and Advent) and you will share the daily watering duties with other volunteers who are on your two-week rotation.

Training

Training needs are assessed continuously, and appropriate on-the-job training is provided.

Please note that some training may take place at a different time than normal volunteering hours, and you must attend all required training sessions.

Travel Expenses

We are grateful to volunteers for giving their time. We will cover travel expenses, subject to Cathedral terms and conditions. Please ask your Volunteer Manager for more information.
