Luxmuralis and Historic Royal Palaces present Crown and Coronation Tuesday 24th–Saturday 28th September, slots between 18:30-21:30

Come to Canterbury Cathedral to experience the splendour of Coronations and the Crown Jewels in this amazing new immersive light show. Crown and Coronation will bring the spectacle, significance and shared experience of Coronations to life, demonstrating the pivotal role of the Crown Jewels, part of the Royal Collection, within the ceremony.

The show will feature stunning imagery spanning more than 1,000 years of history, enhanced by the magnificence of Canterbury Cathedral – host to many kings and queens throughout its incredible history - where the projections and soundscape will sweep through the amazing interiors. The Crown Jewels, the objects at the very heart of the Coronation ceremony, will be projected through detailed footage and an emotive musical score, evoking the sensation of having a private audience with the magnificent collection.

Crown and Coronation has been created by Historic Royal Palaces – the charity that cares for the Tower of London - in partnership with Luxmuralis, as part of an artistic collaboration between artist Peter Walker and composer David Harper. Luxmuralis worked with Canterbury Cathedral in September 2023, with the hugely popular Renaissance show.

Crown and Coronation launched in November 2023 with a spectacular installation within the walls of the Tower of London, just months after the world witnessed the Crown Jewels in use at a Coronation for the first time in 70 years. The show is undertaking a UK-wide tour of famous landmarks and locations until December 2025.

Celebrating Saints' Days

To this end, from September until the end of the year, 12.30 Eucharists on Saints' Days will be discontinued. During this trial period, the regular pattern of 12.30 Eucharists will continue on Wednesdays and Taizé on Mondays, whilst we explore what range of services may be appropriate. Compelling stories of loving our neighbour today

'The everyday God is a God who is for everyone...who appears in everyday events and ordinary people. He calls us to move out of our comfort zones and into his liminal space on the margins of our society, to see the face of Christ in a stranger...' Jonathan Arnold, a seasoned community engagement expert, delves deep into the heart of the biblical mandate to love one's neighbour. Through a tapestry of real-life stories, he unveils the power of practical faith, illustrating how it can ignite transformation among the homeless, refugees, the poor and vulnerable, imprisoned and marginalised, as well as those living with dementia, disability and disease. In these pages, you'll witness how acts of social and environmental justice, intertwined with mercy, have the potential to reshape lives, offering a vivid portrait of the profound impact of embracing the everyday God. As he reflects upon Jesus's teaching in Matthew 25:34-40, Arnold challenges us to discover God's presence in the most unexpected places and join in with where he is acting, whether inside or outside our churches.

NEW Gentle Tours, August & September - Every other Thursday

While our general tours are suitable for all, we know that some visitors with access needs may prefer a shorter tour, at a slower pace, in a smaller group. With this in mind, we are now offering short step-free tours delivered at a gentle pace. These 40-minute tours can be enjoyed on their own, or one after the other with a comfort break in between.

Ground Floor Level - 14:15 Hear the story of Thomas Becket, our most famous Archbishop, and see the site of his murder and feast your eyes on some of our oldest stained glass windows. **First Floor Level (accessible by lift) - 15:15** Explore the Quire and a 'Cadaver tomb', contrast medieval and dramatic modern windows and find out why there is a cannonball in an Archbishop's tomb! Dates: 1, 15 & 29 August 12 & 26 September £5 per person, plus admission charge.
