

We are grateful to the Plaxtol Scholars for singing Evensong today.

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the cathedral church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the mother church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist (or Holy Communion) continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral. Those who are elected as officers of this Cathedral Company are to encourage the members in offering their services in the life of this church. The work of prayer and praise to which you call people is the work of God. Will you gladly take your part in it, to his glory?

The Dean says

Tom, Cathryn, Andrew, and Simon, I confirm you in the offices to which you have been elected, in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. **Amen**

Grant, O Lord, that all who are appointed to ring the bells of this house of prayer may do so worthily to your glory; and that those who shall be called to worship by the ringing of these bells may enter your gates with thanksgiving and your courts with praise; thorough Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

May the Lord enable you to use to his glory the gifts he has given you, and may he watch over your going out and your coming in from this time forth and for evermore.

Apostles' Creed

O God, make clean our hearts within us. *And take not thy Holy Spirit from us.*
