Ecumenical Contemporary Theology Group 5 p.m. on Wednesday 23rd

The next meeting of the ecumenical Contemporary Theology Group will be at 5 p.m. on Wednesday 23rd April (4th Wednesday of the month instead of the usual 3rd) in St Peter's Methodist Church. The speaker will be Rev. Dr Ivan Khovaks of Canterbury Christ Church University and St James, Piccadilly. St James's has recently unveiled paintings by Trinidad -based artist, Che Lovelace, inspired by the story of Ottobah Cugoano, an 18th century former African slave, who was the first person of African descent to be baptised in the church - in the same font as William Blake, the champion of freedom of expression in art. Ivan's presentation will look at these paintings and at the message of the font itself (carved by Grinling Gibbons in 1686) and explore how Cugoano's story encourages St James's to champion freedom for refugees and asylum seekers in our own time.

PASTORAL CARE TRAINING COURSE 2025

Any member of the cathedral congregation who may already be involved in this ministry (to come and share your experience in an environment of mutual learning) Any member of the cathedral congregation who may wonder if this area of the church's ministry is for them and who have expressed recent interest about this to the Dean (to learn what may be entailed in, for example, visiting those who are sick or house-bound at home or in hospital).

Commitment to attending all five sessions is required, although attendance will not automatically oblige you to go forward. At the end of the course each participant will be offered a one-to-one evaluation with one of the course leaders to learn what the course revealed to you and to help you decide the right path ahead for your ministry.
