Today, the fourth Saturday in November, is kept by Ukrainians worldwide as a memorial of the Holodomor, the Soviet-induced famine that devastated Ukraine in 1932-33, and killed millions of people. This year, when countless numbers continue to be killed and injured and millions more displaced by the Russian invasion, the annual commemoration has even greater significance.

Light in the Darkness

The angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there any more.

But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign for ever and ever.

We pray for the souls of all those who have suffered from acts of war, especially for the victims in the land of Ukraine and all other areas of conflict in our world. We pray for Thy peace and Thy mercy in the midst of that great suffering that people are inflicting on each other. Accept the prayers of Thy Church, so that by Thy goodness peace may return to all peoples, O Lord our God, hear us and have mercy.

Lord, have mercy.

O Lord our God, remember and have mercy on our brothers and sisters who are involved in every conflict. Remove from their midst all hostility, confusion and hatred. Lead everyone along the path of reconciliation and peace, we pray Thee O Lord our God, hear us and have mercy. Let all believers turn aside from violence and do what makes for peace. As the prayers and names are read small candles are lit by members of the choir.

O God of spirits and of all flesh, who has conquered death and overthrown the Devil, and given life to Your world, grant, Lord, that the souls of Your departed servants—all who were killed by starvation during the Holodomor in Ukraine, all who perished during the current war, all deceased Christians, and all those remembered here today [names]—may rest in a place of light, a place of green pasture, a place of repose, where there is no sickness, sorrow, or sighing.

Forgive every sin they have committed in thought, word, or deed, as a Good and Loving God. For there is no one who lives and does not sin, You alone are without sin. Your righteousness is an everlasting righteousness, and Your word is truth. For You are the resurrection, the life, and the repose of Your departed servants — all who were killed by starvation during the Holodomor in Ukraine, all who perished during the current war, all deceased Christians, and all those remembered here today [names] —

O Christ our God, and to You, we send up glory, with Your eternal Father and Your holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages.

In blessed repose, grant eternal rest, O Lord, to Your departed servants — all who were killed by starvation during the Holodomor in Ukraine, all who perished during the current war, all deceased Christians, and all those remembered here today [names] —and grant them eternal remembrance.
