Reading of Preamble to UN Charter

WE THE PEOPLES OF THE UNITED NATIONS DETERMINED

to save succeeding generations from the scourge of war, which twice in our lifetime has brought untold sorrow to mankind, and to reaffirm faith in fundamental human rights, in the dignity and worth of the human person, in the equal rights of men and women and of nations large and small, and to establish conditions under which justice and respect for the obligations arising from treaties and other sources of international law can be maintained, and to promote social progress and better standards of life in larger freedom,

AND FOR THESE ENDS

to practice tolerance and live together in peace with one another as good neighbours, and to unite our strength to maintain international peace and security, and to ensure, by the acceptance of principles and the institution of methods, that armed force shall not be used, save in the common interest, and to employ international machinery for the promotion of the economic and social advancement of all peoples,

Matthew 25.31-46

Jesus said: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. Then the king will say to those at his right hand, "Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?" And the king will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." Then he will say to those at his left hand, "You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me." Then they also will answer, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?" Then he will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me." And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.'

Short Readings and Prayers

Around the world, 648 million people live in extreme poverty. They survive on less than \$2.15 a day, an amount which is impossible to support a healthy livelihood in any part of the world.

Without sufficient and sustainable incomes, families cannot afford access to nutritious food, clean water, or health care. As a result, one in three children in low- and middle-income countries suffers from chronic undernutrition. Without treatment, hunger can lead to stunted growth, limited mental and emotional development, and even death.

Action Against Hunger

Lord Jesus, you fed the hungry, you shared your bread with all. Your people hunger now, and we are called to share your bread. May rains fall upon the dry and broken earth and quench your people's thirst, so seeds grow tall and flourish, producing a bountiful harvest. May we share the blessings you give us and bring comfort to those in need. May we show love through our actions so all have enough to eat. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

A most important goal is a humanity that is educated on daily sustainability, human rights, gender equality, notions of non-violence, as well as what it means to be a global citizen. As with many of the SDGs, efforts need to be more concentrated if we can even hope to meet the goals. 260 million schoolaged children are still not regularly in the classroom and over 600 million children fail to meet minimum proficiency levels in reading and mathematics. Illiteracy is still quite high, and there is still a noticeable discrepancy in the quality of facilities and education in places like South Asia and Sub-Saharan Africa as compared to the more developed countries. *Oxford Global*

O God, your Son, Jesus Christ, came to earth as a teacher, using stories to instruct. We pray for all those who enable learning to happen. We pray for learners, as they absorb new information, gain new skills and, discover their particular route through education. We pray for schools, colleges, universities and all places of education around the world. May they be safe places, filled with inspiration and aspiration. We particularly pray for those who have disappeared from the education system: where circumstances have prevented them continuing; where schools have closed; and for all those who are denied an education. We make our prayer through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Humanity stands at a defining moment in history. We are confronted with a perpetuation of disparities between and within nations, a worsening of poverty, hunger, ill health and illiteracy, and the continuing deterioration of the ecosystems on which we depend for our well-being. However, integration of environment and development concerns and greater attention to them will lead to the fulfilment of basic needs, improved living standards for all, better protected and managed ecosystems and a safer, more prosperous future. No

nation can achieve this on its own; but together we can - in a global partnership for sustainable development.
