Canterbury Cathedral October 2024

Welcome

Canterbury Cathedral is the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Cathedral Church of the Diocese of Canterbury, the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion, and a place of pilgrimage welcoming visitors from across the world.

For over fourteen hundred years God has been worshipped here. With its roots in the Benedictine tradition, the ongoing daily pattern of morning and evening prayer and Eucharist continues the prayers and praises of countless generations in this Cathedral.

Alongside this we host a large number of special services, some regular, some occasional. These mark the feasts of the Church's year and significant events in the life of our local community, or offer opportunities for exploring faith and spirituality in creative and diverse ways.

Whether you are a regular worshipper with us, someone who has come to the Cathedral for a special event, or a visitor making a once in a lifetime journey to Canterbury, you are most welcome and an equal part of this community whose story reaches back to Augustine's mission to England in 597 AD.

Regular worship

At the heart of Cathedral life is the regular rhythm of daily prayer. The day begins each morning with the quiet, said services of Morning Prayer (Matins) and the 8.00am Eucharist, and ends with the service of Choral Evensong, with music from the Cathedral Choir or one of the many excellent visiting choirs who come to sing during the Cathedral Choir's holidays, or Said Evening Prayer. The Cathedral's principal act of worship every week is the 11.00am Sunday Choral Eucharist.

Choral Eucharists on Sunday, Choral Evensongs, and other special services are routinely live-streamed and available on our website and via YouTube. Visiting Choirs

The choirs of Northbourne Park and St Edmund's Junior School have a long musical association with many young musicians beginning their education at Northbourne Park before moving on to St Edmund's. Northbourne Park School Choir takes part in the annual St Edmund's Gala Concert in the Cathedral and the combined choirs will be joined by senior pupils from St Edmund's, many of whom were choristers at the Cathedral.

The Lynwood Singers was formed in 2007 and its members come from many parts of the country, meeting on three or four occasions each year, to sing the services for a weekend, or a week. They have sung in roughly half the Cathedrals in England as well as abbeys, minsters, and other churches, all over the country. The choir is looking forward to their third visit to Canterbury.

The choir of St John's, Barham consists of local people of all ages who love to sing traditional English church music. They sing regular Eucharists and occasional Evensongs and are currently preparing a full programme of music for Advent and Christmas.

Ars Musica Studentenkoor is a rather new choir, mainly for current and recent students, from the historical city of Gouda. The members benefit from regular work with a vocal coach to help the choir develop their overall performance. The choir sings a wide variety of music, from Tallis to Taverner, in regular Evensongs as well as the English-style Festival of Lessons and Carols, and other concerts.

Music Events

During the coming academic year, the Music Department will present a wide range of events, including large-scale concerts and intimate recitals, involving the Cathedral's resident musicians, and eminent guest artists.

Organ recitals will start at 6.15pm in the Cathedral's Quire and are free of charge with a retiring collection. Programmes for these concerts are included in the monthly Services and Music List.
